

Louisiana DOC names Tanisha Matthews Director of Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion



Secretary Le Blanc recently created a new position within the Office of the Secretary to facilitate the ongoing Department-wide efforts to ensure diversity, inclusion, and overall staff wellness. He named Tanisha Matthews the Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI). Matthews is uniquely qualified for the position after starting her career in corrections as a cadet at Elayn Hunt Correctional Center (EHCC), then moving to Human Resources (HR), where she worked for four years at EHCC and one year at Dixon Correctional Institute (DCI). She then moved to an HR position at DPS&C Headquarters. She was appointed as the HR Director in 2010 and served in that capacity for eleven years. Matthews describes the potential impact of the new DEI position, saying, "People have to make a decision that prioritizing diversity, equity, and inclusion throughout the Department is an important component of wellbeing, and I'm so grateful that Secretary Le Blanc has a top down vision and has entrusted me with this new role. He has modeled professionalism and inclusion throughout his career and tenure as Secretary, and this new role is an extension of his longstanding vision for the Department."

The first step for Matthews is helping to clearly define the terms, "diversity, equity, and inclusion." She explains, "Diversity is about the mixture we have of people from **different backgrounds**. It includes the things we usually think about like race, nationality, and gender but also some that we don't, like age, veteran status, physical abilities, religion, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, and parental status. Diversity looks at the numbers and the percentage of individuals we have from different backgrounds."

"Equity is about ensuring **fairness** and that all individuals, employees, and incarcerated people, are given equal access to opportunities. For staff, that can include the things we generally think about like recruitment and hiring but also how work assignments are given out, how leave usage is approved, hiring, how we utilize pay mechanisms and advancement opportunities. For the incarcerated population, that can include how housing and work assignments are determined, ensuring equal access to education and programs, and even contact with loved ones though phone calls and visitation." "Inclusion is the piece I'm most excited about because it's about the **culture and work environment.** I once heard that 'diversity is being asked to the party. Inclusion is being asked to dance,' and that really sums it up. Inclusion is ensuring everyone feels welcomed and included. Inclusive environments ensure that the backgrounds and perspectives of others are respected on a daily basis and people from different backgrounds are given opportunities to contribute their ideas and concerns."

While this position will consider many practices involving DPS&C employees, it's always with the ultimate goal of positively impacting the prison population. "It's how you do life. It's not just something you think of in one circumstance. If I value people, that includes the incarcerated population. We want staff who value everyone for what they bring to the table." She continues, "As Secretary Le Blanc often says, 'We are all better than the worst thing we've done.' The people in our custody and under our supervision are someone's son, daughter, sister, brother...and we are rooting for their success. When we effectively communicate and show that we want them to be successful, the likelihood of them being successful increases greatly." "The reality is that the incarcerated population is the most impacted by the Department's hiring practices and the morale of our employees," Matthews says. "The prison population is our largest stakeholder. They live and work at the prison. It is their home. Staff who feel valued and who understand the concepts of treating each individual with respect will in turn do so with coworkers and the incarcerated individuals that they supervise. The ripple effect is quite large and why DEI can play a critical role in the work to ensure that all employees and people in prison are treated with dignity and respect, despite their differences.

Matthews has several objectives when it comes to seeing diversity, equity, and inclusion being actively practiced. "Training of staff is going to be critically important. The DEI Division will spend time at every institution first speaking with and training leaders. We really want to make it both a learning experience and a conversation. I will tour every facility and speak with staff and incarcerated individuals." Matthews is most excited about the numerous possibilities for positive impact this position will create. "Learning from one another and using different perspectives and ideas to reach a common goal means everyone wins, everyone feels included."

VCCW Unveils Family Reunification House Former Home for Wardens Now Nurtures Rebuilding Families

On Kovember 2, the Department held a ribbon sutting ceremony for the Virginia Correctional Center for Women's family reunification frome.

Once used as the worder's residence, the house now provides the setting for a program dedicated to strengthening the annulative mothers and their minor children immediately prior to the mother's release.

Incarcereted mothers who enrollin the 12 week program engage with their children fellowing a structured curriculum for both the mothers and children. They connect visitables, free weekly video visits, and extended day visitation in the roun fraction house twice a month. Additionally, raothers receive coaching on molementing the skills and techniques, carned from parent ing coursework.

The reunification house was recently transtormed, through a partnership with the non-profit organization. Assisting Families of Inmates that brought more than \$20,000 in donations to make the VADOC in tiative alreality.





The committee will consider requests on a "first come first served basis," until the fund is depleted. The Following States Have Representatives with Terms Expiring or Have Expired in 2023: AL,FL,MS, NC,SC,TX and WV

Each member state shall select one of its regular members to serve as State Representative on the Executive Board. The term of the elected State Representative shall be three years. Candidate appli- cations shall be received by the Nominating Committee, screened for eligibility by established crite- ria, and provided for vote to be selected buy a caucus of the appropriate state's regular members. A regular member is any person employed in or honorably retired from any area of the criminal justice system within the borders of the member's state. Only regular members are eligible to vote, hold office in, or be a representative of the Association.

To be eligible for State representative you must have:

- At least two (2) years of continuous active regular membership in SSCA
- Time available to devote to the Association's business
- A willingness to work towards the expansion of SSCA
- Demonstrated knowledge of and working involvement in the Association; i.e. serving on com- mittees, participating in the program, pursuing additional members, developing articles for the Southern Concourse.

To apply for State Representative you must submit the following to the chairman of the SSCA

Nominating Committee:

- A cover letter indication your intent to be considered, an affirmation/ explanation that you meet the eligibility criteria, and why you are seeking the post;
- A current resume/Vita;
- Letters (one each) of support from your agency/department administrator and your immediate supervisor.

Kenneth Law Scholarship

PURPOSE:

The SSCA is a 14-state regional organization of correctional practitioners representing the operational and administrative areas of jails, probation, prisons, and parole. It is the intent of this scholarship award to financially assist individuals preparing to or already participating in an accredited college or university program of study.

PROCESS:

Each year individual(s) will be selected to receive the SSCA Scholarship Award. The process begins at the state level with applicants submitting application packages (form and attachments) to their respective SSCA State Representative no later than **April 1**, **2021** These applications will be screened by a State-level screening committee and one primary and one alternate application will be forwarded to the SSCA Scholarship Award Committee for consideration. The Award Committee will select recipients and award scholarships in an amount and number to be determined by the Executive Board. Applicants will receive written notification of their selection or rejection. Awards will be announced at the annual training conference in **July 2021**.

AMOUNT: The Association will designate a maximum of \$5,000 per year for the scholarship program. Additional contributions may increase the amount of funds available each year. The Executive Board will determine the amount and number of scholarships to be awarded each year to individuals who are Regular members of SSCA, their spouse or dependent children and are pursuing either part-time or full-time formal education at the college or graduate school level. The funds will be deposited with an accredited college or university to apply toward the student's tuition and related academic expenses.

ELIGIBILITY:

- (1) Applicant must be a U.S. Citizen
- (2) Applicant must be an active regular or lifetime SSCA member or a spouse or dependent child of a member.
- (3) Applicant must be pursuing a bachelor or graduate degree in a program of study applicable to the field of criminal justice, rehabilitation, social services or a related field.
- (4) Applicant must be entering his/her freshman, sophomore, junior, senior year or graduate school. Freshman or first year graduate students must be officially accepted in the college or university.
- (5) Applicant must complete the application form, provide all required attachments, and submit the entire package to their State Representative prior to April 1, 2016. The scholarship will be awarded for the next fall term. Incomplete application packages will not be accepted for consideration.

ATTACHMENT TO APPLICATION:

- (1) Beginning freshman will submit two (2) letters from high school instructors under whom the student has studied, stating why they support the applicant's receipt of the scholarship award.
- (2) Sophomores, juniors, seniors, and entering graduate students must submit two (2) letters of recommendation from professors under whom the applicant has studied, stating why they support the applicant's receipt of the scholarship award.
- (3) Beginning freshman must submit a certified transcript of their high school grades to date.
- (4) Sophomores, juniors, seniors, and entering graduate students must submit a certified transcript of their college courses and grades to date.
- (5) Graduate students already matriculating in a graduate program must submit a certified transcript of graduate courses and grades to date.
- (6) Beginning freshman and entering graduate students must submit a copy of their official letter accepting them into the college/university.
- (7) On a separate sheet(s) of paper provide a written narrative supporting/justifying his/her need for this scholarship.

COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) Recipient will only be eligible to receive this scholarship one time.
- (2) Scholarship recipients must forward to the appropriate State Representative a copy of their transcript for the time period the recipient has received the award.
- (3) Failure to satisfactorily complete the semester may result in the recipient being required to repay SSCA the full amount awarded. Satisfactory completion means an overall grade point average of "C" or 2.0 on 4.0 scale for each semester a scholarship was received.
